Thank you for the interest you have shown in the position of Chair of BSHF. We have put this pack together to give you a flavour of who we are, where we are going and how this role contributes to achieving our mission and delivering our strategy.

Established in 1976, BSHF is based in Coalville in Leicestershire, where it has strong historical ties.

BSHF is an independent organisation focussed on helping people around the world access decent housing. It researches and promotes innovative housing policy and practice, and supports the exchange and transfer of good practice. We do this through three related areas of activity:

We identify great housing ideas

Through our research work, the World Habitat Awards competition and our wider networks we are in a great position to spot innovative housing ideas and discover the best housing projects from around the world that deliver positive change for people. In 1985 we established The World Habitat Awards as part of our contribution to the United Nations International Year of Shelter for the Homeless. We have run the competition ever since in partnership with UN-Habitat.

Two awards are given annually to projects that provide practical and innovative solutions to current housing challenges throughout the world. Entries are assessed by a panel of international judges. A cash award of £10,000 and a trophy are presented to each of the winners of the award.

We transfer ideas and practices to places where they are needed most

We work to help bring the benefits of these ideas to the people who need them most. To do this we promote and publicise the best and most innovative housing projects we find and build networks of people best able to implement those ideas and practice.

Every year we run two peer exchanges bringing together people around the world to learn from the best housing practices. The most recent peer exchanges have been to visit housing projects of international importance in Palestine, The United States and Finland.

We help new ideas grow, so they benefit the people who need them

Where it is necessary, we go further. We help facilitate and implement the best ideas into new contexts. These programmes involve in-depth work and require significant extra resources so we will undertake no more than three at any one time. Currently we are running two such programmes:

- A UK-based programme that aims to empower communities by scaling up Community Led Housing.
- A programme aimed at ending chronic street homelessness (or rough sleeping) in European cities. We are helping establish new approaches and practices in six European Cities. If this is successful we aim to scale up the programme to a larger group of cities.

Since 2006 BSHF has held Special Consultative Status with the United Nations Economic and Social Council, reflecting our work in support of the goals of UN-Habitat.

It has been my privilege to play a key role in the running of the Foundation but I am now stepping down as Chair. My tenure has been both challenging and rewarding and over that time we have approved a new Strategy 2015-2018.

Our achievements are in no small way down to the dedicated and talented people that I have had the pleasure to work alongside over the years: Council of Management members, our Director and staff team, and all those who collaborate with us.

I know that my successor will enjoy the same level of support that I have been given while leading BSHF on the next steps of its exciting journey.

BSHF - Chair of the Council of Management - How to make an application

Thank you for your interest in this role. BSHF is a unique organisation; small, yet genuinely global, and proudly independent. The challenges of inadequate housing are vast, but our strategy of finding the best housing practice and helping it grow where it is needed most makes a difference. It may seem unlikely that a relatively small organisation in Leicestershire can improve people's housing on a global scale. But I believe we can. - Complete the declaration form; and
- Indicate on the declaration form if you cannot attend the interview dates.

Please note that applications can only be considered if all the documentation is completed.

However, it is not mandatory to complete the equalities section within the declaration form. The information requested is for monitoring purposes in line with our commitment to equality and diversity, and will not affect the outcome of your application.
